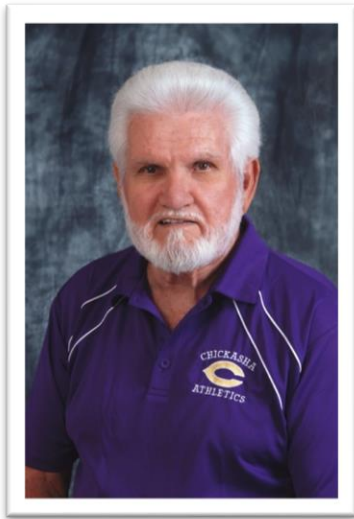


Herman Stephens
