Dr. Mobley attended Chickasha High School and graduated with honors in 1987. She attended the University of Oklahoma and graduated Summa cum laude with a Bachelor of Arts degree in journalism and professional writing in 1991. As a student at the university, she was the recipient of various honors and awards and was selected as a member of Phi Beta Kappa, Omicron Delta Kappa and Gamma Gamma Order of Omega honor societies.

Dr. Mobley did her graduate studies at the University of Wisconsin-Madison where she earned her Master's and Ph. D. degrees in European History in 1993 and 1998. She was the recipient of a J. William Fulbright grant for the 1995-1996 academic years. The Fulbright grant permitted her to conduct archival research at the University of Tübingen and at Stuttgart and Munich, Germany.

Dr. Mobley is currently the Chair of the History Department and Associate Professor of History at Concordia University in Wisconsin. She has written two books, Confessionalizing the curriculum: the faculties of arts and theology at the universities of Tübingen and Ingolstadt in the second half of the sixteenth century and Geschichte der Universität in Europa. Band II: Von der Reformation zur Französischen Revolution (1500-1800).
